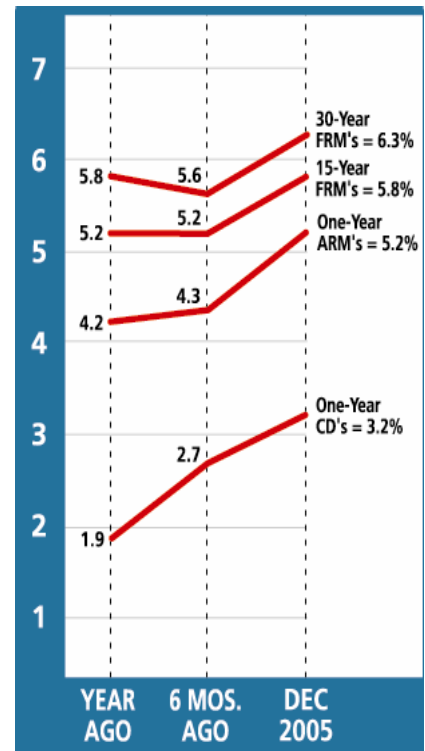

According to the National Association of Home Builders, windows are one of the largest sources of heat loss in the winter due to their low insulating ability and high air leakage rates. As a result, windows can be responsible for losing 25 to 50 percent of the energy used to heat and cool

Choose Your Payment Method Wisely

Whenever you need to cancel a product purchase, keep in mind there are distinctions between payment methods:

Credit Cards—They provide the most leverage in disputes such as billing mistakes or defective products.

Debit Cards—They do not allow you to withhold payment. The money comes straight out of your checking account.

Checks—They offer less legal protection so be sure you know the seller's reputation and refund policy that may have changed since your original decision to buy.

New Passport Rules

As of December 31, 2006, Americans will need a passport for all air and sea travel to and from Mexico and Canada, Central and South Americas, the Caribbean and Bermuda. By December 2007, a passport will be required for land crossings to Canada and Mexico. Prior to these dates, only a driver's license or birth certificate was required for travel to Canada and Mexico. Managing Finances

Financial planners advise that managing finances *now* determines the quality of life in our later years. Here are the basic ways to improve financial health: Continually look for ways to save more; review investment risks; look for ways to boost returns on investments; and, cut your taxes. Any small changes in the above can make a large difference in the years ahead.

The Well-Equipped Car

A well-equipped car is one that contains important emergency items in the trunk and glove compartment. Here's a simple checklist of items to consider:

In the Trunk:

- Fluids... windshield washer, engine oil, water
- Tool kit... jack, lug wrench, flat fixer
- Jumper cables
- Emergency flares



In the passenger and/or glove compartment:

- Emergency first aid kit
- "Contact Police" emergency sign
- Flashlight, extra batteries
- Phone numbers of towing services
- Owner's manual, registration
- Maps
- Extra fuses
- Insurance card and "Auto Insurance Guide"

Home Safety Tip

Carbon Monoxide is a colorless, odorless, tasteless gas that can take oxygen from the air causing sickness or even death. Furnaces and gas appliances that are poorly maintained or misused (as well as burning wood) can produce this gas. Warning signs include:

- Large yellow unsteady burner flame;
- Pungent odor sometimes when appliance is running;
- Nausea, drowsiness and flu-like symptoms that are unexplained.



If you suspect carbon monoxide poisoning get to fresh air outdoors and get emergency medical attention. Hire a licensed professional to check appliances, chimneys and furnaces. Also, install at least one carbon monoxide detector/ alarm preferably on a wall 5 feet above the floor or on the ceiling away from the heat source. (This alarm is in addition to a smoke alarm as a smoke alarm cannot detect Carbon Monoxide.)

Estate Planning Ahead



Estate planning is generally defined as the process of making decisions that provide a legal and practical

mechanism to dispose of property after death that acknowledges the owner's wishes and the needs of the survivors while minimizing taxes. But, when should an estate plan be reviewed and updated? According to Michael T. Palermo, JD, CFP, in his book Estate Planning, it is wise to review when certain life changes occur: changes in whom you want to receive your property; changes in your finances; and changes in your state of residence.

Reviewing your estate plan does not necessarily mean revising it but it is important to be sure there is no need for change(s).

Home-Remedy Carpet Care

The following are tried-and-true tips from experts on carpet stain removal and cleaning:

Fresh stains

Pour a little club soda on the spot and sponge up in a few seconds or apply shaving cream to spots and sponge up.

Older stains

Combine 2 tablespoons detergent, 3 tablespoons vinegar, 1 quart warm water and work into stain and blot excess.

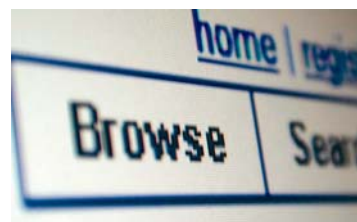
Stubborn stains

Combine laundry detergent and warm water, brush suds into stain with toothbrush, blot excess and repeat if necessary.
